I. WHAT IS ALEKS? WHY SHOULD I PREPARE BEFORE TAKING IT?

ALEKS is an adaptive computer-based placement test used to help determine which Math classes you are ready for at Kodiak College, UAA.

While preparation is **not** required, we do advise it because the higher you score, the fewer classes you'll have to take to reach your goals! **Note that the ALEKS practice modules are only available after you've completed your initial placement exam in ALEKS**.

II. HOW TO TAKE THE TEST

Apply for admissions.		
Once you have your UAOnline ID and password, complete the test in one of two ways		
o From Home: Visit https://www.alaska.edu/aleks and click on "Take the Test."		
o From the Kodiak College Test Center: Visit https://koc.alaska.edu/academic-		
resources/test-center or call 907-486-1232 to make an appointment.
